### Day 1 – Arrive Launceston – 12<sup>th</sup> May

Arrive to Launceston Airport and collect mini bus to get you around the Apple Isle (includes unlimited kilometres, insurance, fees and taxes). Drive into Launceston and settle into your accommodation. For those who arrive in time, take on the Quamby Estate Golf Course. Quamby's golf course is a rare gem on the Tasmanian golf circuit. Constructed in the early 1990's, this beautiful course is positioned on a high elevation with magnificent views to Ben Lomond in the East and the Great Western Tiers to the South. Fairways are lined by large mature trees planted in rows with garden avenues, hedgerows, watercourses, lakes and ponds. This picture-book landscape offers a challenging and entertaining experience for golfers of varied ability and experience.

### Day 2 – Launceston – Bridport – 13<sup>th</sup> May

Drive from Launceston to Bridport. Arrive and head to your accommodation right on the course. You will spend the next two days playing on some of the best courses in the world! Today it's The Dunes, an 18 hole course and is 2<sup>nd</sup> in Australia and 11<sup>th</sup> in the world ranking.

### Day 3 – Bridport – 14<sup>th</sup> May

a 20 hole course and is 3<sup>rd</sup> in Australia and 23<sup>rd</sup> in the world, you will be playing here today! While you're in the area, you can check out some of the great vineyards close by to you on your wine tour. Be picked up from your accommodation and taken around to all the award winning vineyards with views to boast. Come back to your accommodation and enjoy the wining & dining at your accommodation.

### Day 4 – Bridport – Launceston – 15<sup>th</sup> May

Drive from Bridport today back into Launceston. Head to the first Distillery in Launceston in 175 years. Launceston Distillery sits proudly in the heart of Tasmania, based at Launceston Airport's Hangar 17 – the state's oldest commercial aviation building. Our home is the gateway to Northern Tasmania, a region rich in natural beauty and renowned for its premium food, wine and, now, whisky. Head back into the city and take a short walk from your hotel and afternoon enjoy the James Boags Brewery Tour. James Boag has been refreshing the palates of beer lovers since 1881, and you have the opportunity to discover what goes into producing Australia's premium beer.

### Day 5 – Launceston – Hobart – 16<sup>th</sup> May

Drive from Launceston to Hobart today. Take a short detour through to Ratho Farm on your

way through. It is Australia's oldest golf course, and the oldest remaining outside of Scotland. Play 9 holes here on the historic course and enjoy the beautiful sights surrounding you. NANT Distillery is close by if you're a whiskey fan too and has great views for a lunch stop. Come into Hobart and that late afternoon take on the Cascade Brewery Tour to compare the two Tassie local beers. Step inside Australia's oldest operating brewery to learn how Cascade has been crafting beer since 1832. Our guides will share Cascade's fabled recipe; a dash of history, a healthy dose of Tasmania's finest ingredients and a generous amount of brewing craft. After the tour, sample from a range of Cascade beers and Mercury ciders from the bar before heading into the city to enjoy Salamanca Place for dinner.

### Day 6 – Depart Hobart – 17<sup>th</sup> May

This morning, tee off one last time at the Royal Hobart Golf Club. Royal Hobart is recognised as Tasmania's premier members' Club and particular emphasis is placed on presenting the course in impeccable condition all year round. Royal Hobart has hosted a number of major Championship events over the years including the Tasmanian Open, Australian Amateur, Australian Women's Amateur and the Qantas Australian Open in 1971 which was won by the legendary Jack Nicklaus. After your round, drive back to the airport and drop the vehicle off as you depart. Flights depart in the late afternoon. Thank you for visiting Tasmania!
